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Aims and Scope

The objective of the *International Journal of Pavement Research and Technology* is to provide a platform to promote exchange of ideas among pavement engineering communities around the world. The journal attempts to disseminate information on all aspects of pavement engineering and technology developed through research and practical experiences.

The journal is published bi-monthly, in January, March, May, July, September, and November each year. Contributions in the form of *paper* and *technical notes* will be considered for publication. To cover a wide range of pavement engineering disciplines and industrial applications, the journal includes the following topics:

Awards

The first biennial Best Paper Awards have been selected by the Journal Award Committee. The two award winning papers are:

- Effective Modulus Variation and Field Distributions with Depth Using a Multilayered Pavement Program, by Wael Alkasawneh, Ernie Pan, Feng Han, Ronghua Zhu, and Roger Green; a cash prize of \$2,000 was awarded to this Winning paper.
- Flow Characteristics and Viscosity Functions in Asphalt Binders Modified by Wax, by Felice Giuliani and Filippo Merusi; this Runner-up paper was awarded a cash prize of \$1,000.

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
